

Oregon Junior Pork Producers Sweepstakes

Rules and other Information

1. OJPP Junior dues must be paid. Sweepstakes points start counting on the day OJPP membership dues are paid.
2. Junior dues are \$5
3. You must be YQCA certified to be eligible for OJPP Sweepstakes Points.
4. There are Four age divisions as of January 1, 2024: Novice (8 and under) Junior (9-12), Intermediate (13-16) Senior (17-21).
5. There will be three divisions-Market/Prospect, Breeding and Showmanship for each age division.
6. You may compete in as many shows as you like-there is no minimum number of shows that you must participate in to be eligible. You only need pay your OJPP membership dues to be entered in the Sweepstakes. You only need to pay once to be entered.
7. OJPP members must show their own animal during the entered Jackpot show. If a member has 2 animals entered in the same class, another member can show 1 of the animals. Accommodations can be made for members showing multiple species. Member must contact OJPP leadership before the class enters the ring to make arrangements.
8. Pigs must be owned 30 days prior to the jackpot show for points to accumulate for sweepstakes for that animal. If the jackpot show /Jr show has another ownership date, the OJPP Sweepstakes will follow the shows ownership date deadline.
9. Points will be accumulated from September 8th 2024, to September 1st, 2025 on all eligible shows voted by the OJPP board members.
10. The sweepstakes year will end at the Oregon State Fair. Awards will be handed out before the OPP boar and gilt sale at the Oregon State fair on Sunday, September 3rd.
11. A skill-a-thon will be held online. Time and date to be announced on or before August 21st. Skill-a-thon points will be used as extra points on whatever the junior member would like. Members are allowed to split their points between divisions as well. They will be asked at the conclusion of their test what divisions they would like points applied.
12. Awards will be presented to the top five of each age group and division.

13. Points are calculated on the highest placing animal entered at the livestock show by the member. If you enter five pigs, the pig with the highest placing will count for that shows points in each division.

14. Points are earned as follows:

Breeding/market

1st place = 20 points

2nd place = 18 points

3rd place = 16 points

4th place = 14 points

5th place = 12 points

6th place = 10 points

7th place = 8 points

8th place = 6 points

9th place = 4 points

10th place = 2 points

11th place and lower or the exhibitor didn't receive a placing but are listed on the class results = 1 point

Breed/Market Division Champion = 10 points

Breed/Market Division Reserve Champion = 5 points

Grand Overall Champion = 20 points

Reserve Grand Overall Champion = 15 points

3rd Overall = 10 points

4th Overall = 8 points

5th Overall = 5 points

Showmanship

Participation in showmanship = 5 points

Making the champion drive = 10 points

Top five in each age division receives:

Grand Overall Champion = 20 points

Reserve Grand Overall Champion = 15 points

3rd Overall = 10 points

4th Overall = 8 points

5th Overall = 5 points
